IT MAY BE EMPTY—BUT IT'S NOT WORTHLESS

Once described as being no larger than the eye of a needle to shooters and the Grand Canyon to goaltenders—the goal, at four feet high and six feet wide still remains the most sought after piece of real estate on the ice. If this is true, then there is no object in the game of hockey that is more tantalizing than that of an unprotected or empty net.

The traditional situation that produces an empty net is one of a hard fought game in which one team is behind by a goal in the waning moments of the contest. In an effort to get the tying goal that team will pull its goalie, leaving their net unprotected, for an extra skater. The object of this move is for each player to take a man, if done successfully it will free the extra skater so that he can shoot at the goalie in a one-on-one situation.

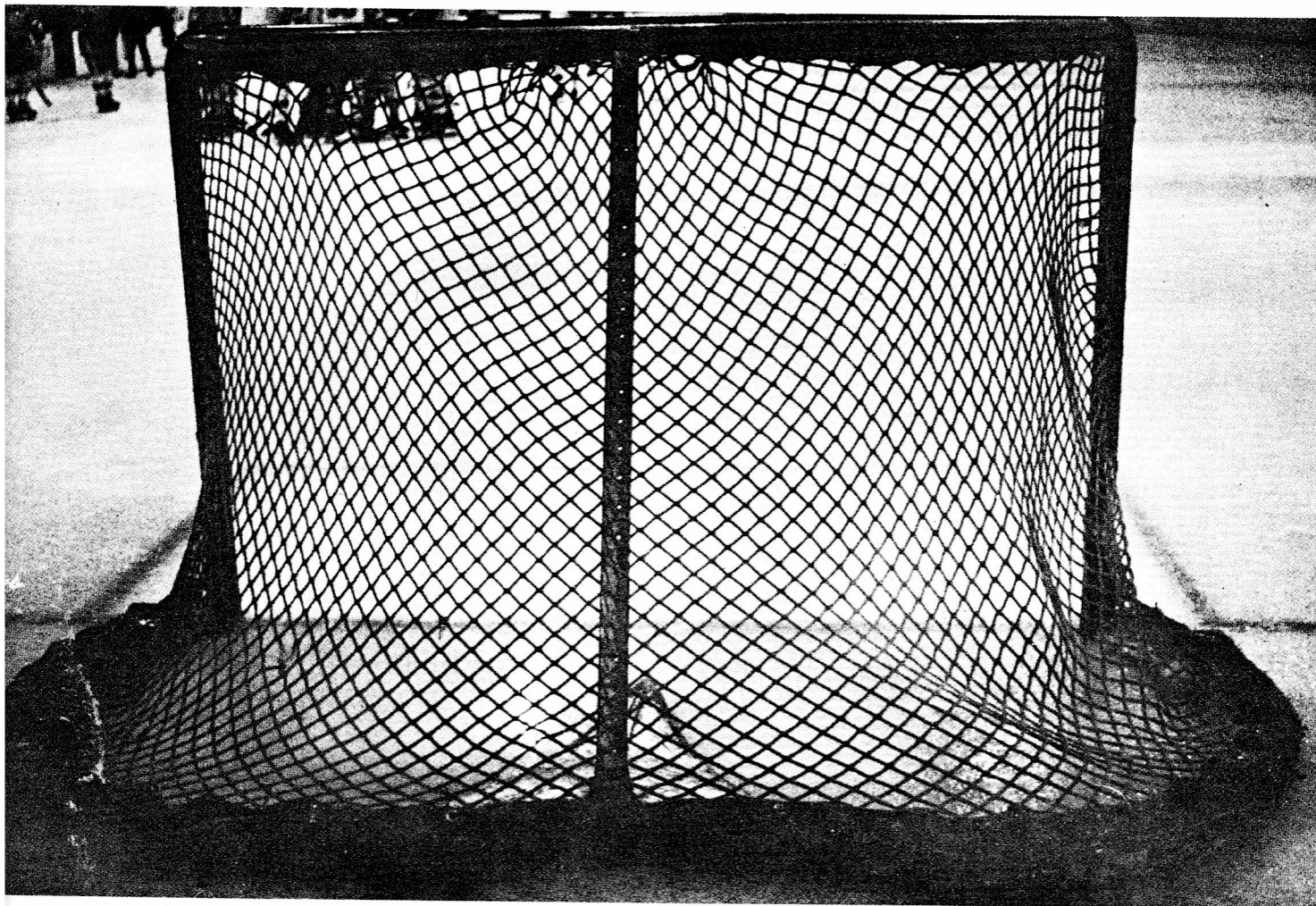
Looking at it realistically, the sum of the pressures of the clock, the cheering of the crowd, and the desire of the opposing team not to yield that tying goal make the odds of denting the back of the twine and netting that seemingly lost point very remote.

What usually ensues is spontaneous, frantic action all over the ice whereby a member of the team in the lead eventually gets possession of the puck and in a desperate attempt to get the puck out of his zone lofts a high, arcing clearing pass that lands in center ice. Then almost as if the rubberoid disc had radar it begins to move toward the cage. Slowly it slithers, the anticipation in the crowd begins to rise—they are on their feet now—a deep breath is taken by all. Even the players seem to just watch in a fate-like state of mind.

It's by the blue line. The puck splits the circles, through the slot. It's close, will the rubber disc hit the post and bound away or carom in. Ever so slowly it moves through the crease, just beyond the reach of a defenseman's stick.

It's, It's...

Come out to a hockey game and see for yourself if it's the ecstasy of a goal or the agony of an icing. Either way you will enjoy yourself.



The Penalty Shot

When asked what they feel is the single most exciting event in hockey, most people will say—"The Penalty Shot." Who can deny the element of excitement that is generated by this moment, when only one player from each team is pitted against each other for so brief a time—to share the spotlight—one victor—one loser.

The excitement is felt by both spectator & player alike. The shooter whirling in center ice approaching the puck that's been placed on the center ice face off spot by the referee. The goaltender, confined to the crease of the net until the shooter touches the puck. The shooter moves across the blue line—the goaltender comes out of the net area to challenge him. The shooter increases his speed—the goaltender increases his concentration, crouches in anticipation of the shot to come. The shooter deciding the best way to put the puck past the goaltender—the goaltender bent on stopping his efforts. He shoots—!!!!!!

But why, you may ask, does this event generate so much excitement? Why do the players feel such a tremendous victory or overwhelming defeat?

One reason is because it is unique. Very few are awarded. Most players can go through an entire hockey career without ever being involved in one.

Secondly, the abruptness of it. The play is stopped by the referee's whistle and all of a sudden two people are thrust into the position of having their entire respective teams dependent upon each of them. No amount of practice can prepare either of them for the upcoming event.

Lastly, the thrill of one on one. Fact to face across the icy field of competitive combat. One out to best the other. No friends on this battlefield. One winner—one loser. It has to be this way—there are no ties.

For the winner comes the tumultuous congratulations of his teammates. To the loser comes the condolences of down-hearted hockey players.

When all the congratulations and all the condolences are over, the game will go on. And when it does, there comes the hope that maybe—just maybe, we'll see another—Penalty Shot.

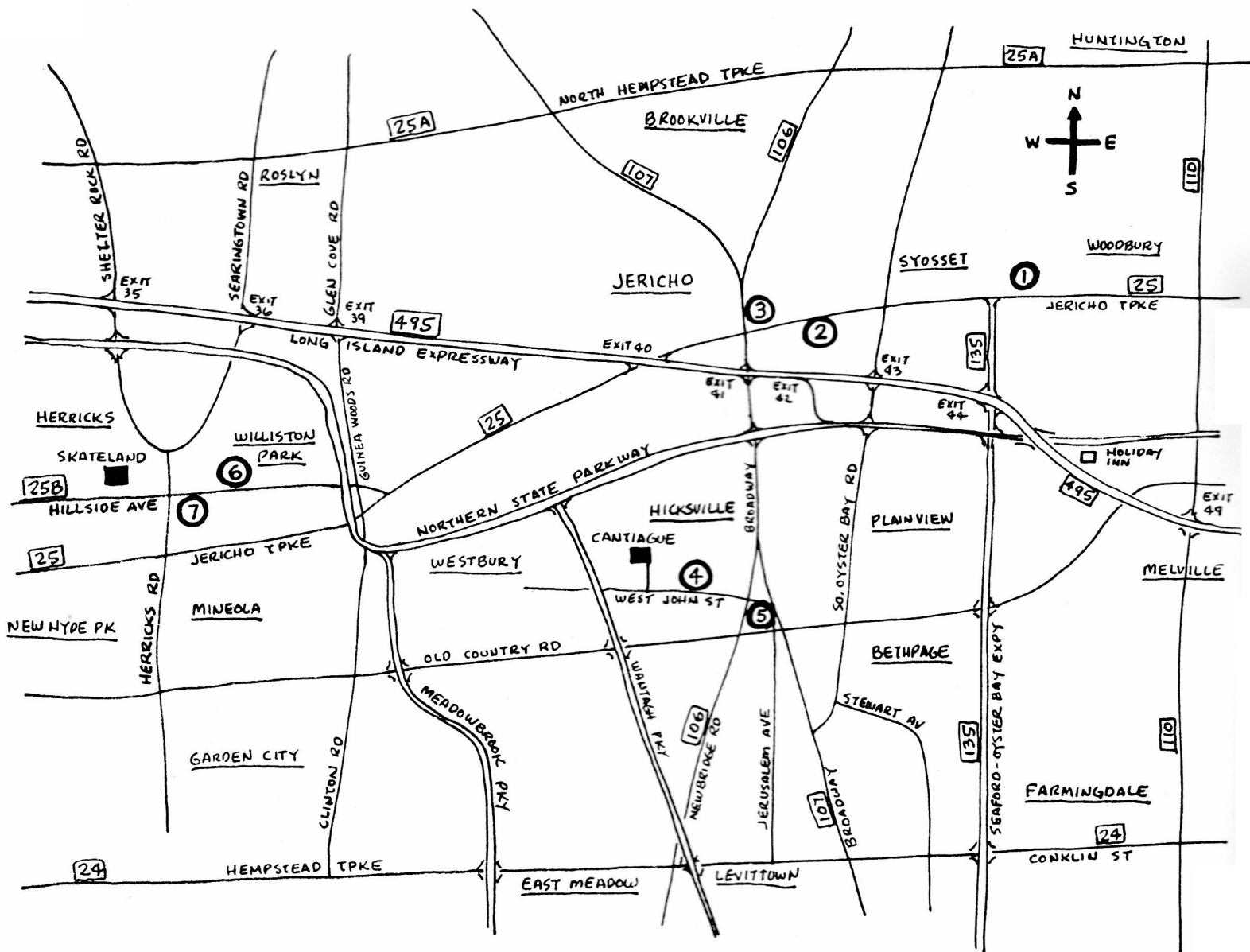
